An audio course with 26 audio CDs. The CDs are entirely in Latin while the accompanying coursebook includes some English. Each of the lessons includes components on classical Latin, ecclesiastical Latin, and contemporary Latin. There is an emphasis on repetition, and on speaking and hearing the language.

## SACRED SCRIPTURE

Reading Scripture – especially familiar portions like the Gospels or the Psalms – is a useful way of developing one's vocabulary.

The complete text of the Vulgate as revised by order of Pope Paul VI and promulgated by Pope Saint John Paul II.

#### The Navarre Bible.

The Latin text of the Nova Vulgata, the English text of the Revised Standard Version, and an English commentary. Search the catalogue for "Navarre Bible".

In the 1963 Constitution *Sacrosanctum concilium*, the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council taught that "steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them."

## **PRAYERS**

In his 2007 Apostolic exhortation *Sacramentum caritatis*, Pope Benedict XVI re-affirmed "that the faithful can be taught to recite the more common prayers in Latin".

This book is a translation of those prayers to which the Church formerly attached indulgences (until 1969). Those prayers which were published in Italian, are presented here only in English; but those prayers which were published in Latin, are presented here in both English and Latin.

A Manual of Prayers for the Use of the Catholic Laity. Prepared and enjoined by order of the Third Plenary Council of Baltimore. New York: P.J. Kenedy, 1930. [St. Michael's 3rd Floor – BX 2110 .C365 1930]

This collection includes many prayers in Latin with side-by-side English translation.

## SPIRITUAL AND THEOLOGICAL CLASSICS

Many Latin spiritual and theological classics have a reasonably small vocabulary base and a simple sentence structure.
