



DICTIONARIES

Each of these works includes brief articles about artistic styles, church furnishings and symbols, Biblical characters and events, saints, and Christian artists. The articles in the Oxford Companion are the longest and perhaps the most scholarly. But each work includes topics not in the other two books.

ENCYCLOPEDIC WORKS

The Dictionary of Art. New York: Grove, 1996. 34 volumes. [Available online for UofT use: http://www.library.utoronto.ca] [Print: St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference – N 31 .D5 1996]

In over 41,000 articles, this mammoth work covers the visual arts from around the world from prehistory to the 1990s. Included are articles on painting, sculpture, architecture, graphic and decorative arts, and photography. In addition, influences on the production of art such as religion, trade, geography, history and politics are fully addressed.

Encyclopedia of World Art. New York: McGraw-Hill, 1959-68. 15 volumes + 2 supplements. [St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – N 31 .E53]

Lengthy articles by subject specialists on "architecture, sculpture, and painting, and every other man-made object that, regardless of its purpose or technique, enters the field of esthetic judgment because of its form or decoration." The second half of each volume consists of plates illustrating the articles in the first half of the volume.

New Catholic Encyclopedia. 2nd edition. Washington, DC: Gale, 2003. 15 volumes.

The major English-language encyclopedia on Catholic topics, this work contains some 17,000 articles, each with a bibliography. There is an article entitled "Art, Articles on" which provides an overview of the encyclopedia's artistic content and identifies several hundred entries relating to the visual arts. Unfortunately many of the articles in the 2003/online edition are reprints from the 1967 edition without any updating.

Iconography of Christian Art. By Gertrud Schiller. Greenwich, Conn.: New York Graphic Society, 1971-1972. 2 volumes.

[St. Michael's 2nd Floor – N 7830 .S3513]

An English-language translation of the first two volumes of the 8 volume German edition (Robarts 12th Floor – N 7830 .S35). Lengthy articles on representations of events from the life of Christ. Black-and-white illustrations of over 1000 works of art.

Saints in Italian Art. By George Kaftal. Florence: Le lettere, 1952-1985. 4 volumes. [Thomas Fisher Rare Book Library – E-10/3661, 3662, 3667, 4175]

Each volume considers how the saints and blessed are represented in the paintings of a particular area of Italy. Many illustrations.

Iconographie de l'art chrétien. By Louis Reau. Paris: Presses Universitaires de France, 1955. 3 volumes in 6.

Volume 1 includes introductory articles about Christian symbolism. The articles in volume 2 (parts 1 and 2) consider the representation of various biblical stories and characters. The articles in volume 3 (parts 1, 2, and 3) consider the representation of Christian saints. Each article includes a list of major works of art and a very specific bibliography.

Lexikon der christlichen Ikonographie. Edited by Engelbert Kirschbaum. Rome: Herder, 1968-1976. 8 volumes.

[St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – BV 150 .L4]

This work is similar to Reau's *Iconographie de l'Art Chretien* - but it is more a work of reference with longer bibliographies and lists of major works of art. The articles in volumes 1 to 4 consider the representation of particular biblical characters, events, and symbols. The articles in volumes 5 to 8 consider the representation of particular Christian saints, but with very little explanation. Many black-and-white illustrations.

HANDBOOKS OF SYMBOLS

Signs & Symbols in Christian Art. By George Ferguson. New York: Oxford University Press, 1954. [St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – N 7830 .F37]

Fourteen chapters on the Christian symbolism of animals, flowers, the human body, angels, biblical characters, saints, colours, and religious objects.

Church Symbolism. By F. R. Webber. Cleveland, OH: Jansen, 1938.

[St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – BV 150 .W4 1938]

An explanation of the more important symbols of the Bible and the Church. Includes symbols for God (e.g. the triangle) and the saints. Illustrated with pen drawings.

Dictionary of Symbols. By Carl G. Liungman. Santa Barbara, CA: ABC CLIO, 1991. [St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – BL 603 .L5413 1991]

Brief descriptions of approximately 1,500 ideograms used in the Western world.

Chapters on Byzantine, Romanesque, and Gothic art, including architecture, sculpture, and painting. Highly illustrated with line drawings.

Encyclopedia of Women in Religious Art. By Diane Apostolos-Cappadona. New York: Continuum, 1996.

Myth & Religion in European Painting, 1270-1700. By Satia and Robert Bernen. New York: Braziller, 1973.

[St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – ND 1288 .B47]

The stories of 850 common painting subjects drawn from classical mythology, ancient history, the Bible, and lives of the saints. Quotations and summaries from the Bible and from ancient, medieval and Renaissance writers tell the stories as the painters themselves might have known them.

Encyclopedia of Comparative Iconography: Themes Depicted in Works of Art. Edited by Helene E. Roberts. Chicago: Fitzroy Dearborn, 1998. 2 volumes.

[St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area – N 7565 .E53 1998]

Instead of relating the stories of particular biblical or mythological characters, this work treats the themes of these stories (e.g. abandonment, abduction, adultery). Numerous Christian themes are included: annunciation, apocalypse, baptism, communion, damned souls, death, dreams, grieving, judgment, light, logos, martyrdom, peace, penitence, sacrifice, shepherds, temptation.

Over one million bibliographic citations to journal articles, essays in books, and book reviews in the field of religion. Covers all aspects of the major world religions and now includes all the content of the online *Catholic Periodical and Literature Index*. For Catholic journal articles published between 1930 and 1980 use the print version of *Catholic Periodical and Literature Index* (St. Michael's 1st Floor Reference Area - AI 3 .C3).

Index of Christian Art.

Princeton University's index provides information on Christian artwork from the eastern and western churches from the apostolic era to medieval times. The approximately 200,000 records in this index provide bibliographic information and, in many cases, photographic reproductions of the artwork.
